Marline Kalin In Memoriam

Marline Kalin, poet, mother and long-time Stroll member, died in Edmonton on June 18.

A teacher and artist, Marline is survived by two daughters, Avril of Winlaw, B.C. and Laurissa of London, England; her mother Olga Figol; three brothers, numerous cousins, aunts, uncles, nieces and nephews, and best friends.

Stroll members read selections of her poems during a prayer service June 23. Funeral services were held June 24 at St. John's Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Cathedral, with interment at Fedora Cemetery near Bon Accord. Friends and family gathered that evening at the century-old Fedora Hall for a time of remembering.
