Irish Poet and Priest tries a U of A retreat (extract from Folio, March 2, 1997 by Bert Almon) Michael McCarthy, spiritual director of the Ushaw Seminary at the University of Durham, England & native of County Cork, spent six months of his sabbatical at the University of Alberta to write poetry. He took part in classes, as student & teacher, & devoted his time to the muse. Why Edmonton? Michael answers, "I imagined that by crossing geographical frontiers. expanding psychological frontiers would be easier." He has a sharp wit. His poetry is insightful, using imagery from dreams, Irish folklore, rural Ireland, and the Bible to explore the inner life. Michael was one of the poet performers for the 1996 Stroll, The Twelve Days, and the Reading Series: March 18, the blues, the spirit. Michael has become a well loved, Stroll celebrity. We bid him farewell on his return to England in May, and hope he returns when our weather will treat him kinder.
