

## Anthology Guidelines

Every poet who performs at the Stroll is invited to submit one poem & a bio for inclusion in this year's Stroll of Poets Anthology. (The poem does not have to be one that you perform at the Stroll.)

#### Specifications

- Poems must have a title.
- · Maximum length of poem, not including a one-line title but including spaces between stanzas: 28 lines.
- Maximum width of poem: 58 spaces. (Each poem & bio gets one page in the Anthology.)
- · Bios should be no more than 75 words.

#### Submissions

- · Poems & bios must be typed on 8 1/2 x 11 inch white paper.
- · Put your name on the back of the poem.
- · Type your bio on a separate sheet of paper.
- · Don't staple the pages together. Your copies must not be wrinkled or stained as photocopies will be made.
- · Please put the two pages into a large envelope.
- · Please put your name on the outside of the envelope.
- · Give the envelope to the Host of your performance group at the Stroll.
- · Sign your Host's submission sheet.

### The 12 Days of Poetry Selection Contest

If you want your Anthology submission to be considered by a panel of jurors who will choose 44 poems to be read at the 12 Days of Poetry Stroll, let us know by writing on the outside of your envelope something like "Yes! I want to be part of the 12 Days of Poetry selection contest" OR else write "No, I don't want to be part of the 12 Days of Poetry selection contest." Make it clear





## Poetry Marathon

The Hope Foundation is looking for a few keen poets to help create Canada's first Poetry Marathon.

There are dozens of marathons & races for those who want to exercise their legs & lungs. So what about an opportunity for those who want to share a favourite poem?

The first ever poetry marathon was held two years ago in London. The idea is simple—people are invited to learn a poem & on the marathon day come together & speak their poem aloud for an audience. Anyone can take part. The poetry can be the presenter's own or someone else's. Participants raise money by getting sponsors for their poem—by line or lump sums.

The goals are: to add to the many good things already happening in Edmonton, to

enhance awareness & interest in poetry, to nourish a sense of community through the connection of shared poetry, & to raise some money to support The Hope Foundation's work.

Initial discussions have suggested a February date for the marathon, so a working committee to make it happen needs to begin active soon.

#### INSTRUCTIONS & SUGGESTIONS FOR STROLL PERFORMERS & HOSTS at the 7th Annual Stroll of Poets Festival

#### Performers

- Find your name on the schedule. Your group reads at one venue, either at 1 p.m., 2 p.m., 3 p.m., or 4 p.m.
- The host of your group should call you about a week or so before the Stroll. If he or she does not manage to reach you, SHOW UP ANYWAY. Go to your venue 15 minutes before show time.
- Bring with you: poems to read, material to submit to the anthology (see guidelines in newsletter) & a brief bio
- on a card to give to your host so he or she can introduce you.

  You will have a minutes to read. If you like to introduce your poems, take that into account. Be courteous of the "air time" of the poets who follow ou. Time the reading of your poetry at home before reading at the Stroll so you are comfortable with the 5 minute time limit.
- Read slowly & clearly. You might begin by asking if people can hear you. The audience is there because they want to hear & understand you. They don't want you to rush away. They like you. Make your pauses count in a dramatic way. Read your lines like you mean them.
- Look at the people in the audience. Since there is no hurry, you have time to look up from your pages. It helps immensely in getting people's undivided attention.
- Read slowly & clearly. Try to relax & have a good time. It's a festival!!!

#### Hosts

- Contact the members in your group about a week before the Stroll. Go over times, places, reading order, & introductions. Check whether any poets have any special plans for their performances.
- Remind poets that they have 5 minutes to perform.
- Each poet receives a \$10 honorarium. You are responsible to distribute the honoraria & having the poets sign for it.
- Please pick-up the honoraria from Doug Elves at the Strathcona Legion at 10 a.m. the day of the Stroll, October 5.
- Collect the anthology submissions from the poets.
- Deliver the anthology submissions to Nancy MacKenzie a the No Bards Barred Bar.
- At each venue the hosts asks the staff where to set up the reading space. In cafes, bistros, & pubs special arrangements need to be struck with the staff to minimize noise during the readings. Try to give a 5 minute warning to the audience so they can place orders & so the staff can finish whatever they're doing with the cappuccino machines before the readings start.
- Introduce each poet --- brevity is of the essence
- Thank the venue & staff.
- Announce the No Bards Barred Bar --- see newsletter for details
- Enjoy yourself!!!
