One day, a poet will spontaneously combust behind the microphone. And their words - screams, really - will have set the audience's ears on fire.

Thank the Good Lord there are those who carry such a big torch for The Word. This summer, Stroll of Poets has definitely been "fanning the flame" with RAVING POETS, an Open Stage series at the Backroom Vodka Bar on Whyte Avenue. Every Tuesday night, we have seen NEW (and usually young) poets get rapturously close to spontaneous combustion. So, too, have we seen new members signing up to be Strollers! And great crowds, vast and surprisingly attentive.

And the media's been really supportive, too. I did interviews with CJSR and CKUA and together with my brilliant co-host Thomas Trofimuk, got WIRED on the A Channel.

Each night, Thomas and I have been providing live music for the poets. Each night, the audience has voted the Best Poet of the Night. Each "best poet" made it to the "best of" live performance night at B Scene Studios, Aug. 31<sup>st</sup>, where and when the readings (with musical accompaniment) were burned onto a CD.

The "CD release party" and big, final showcase of RAVING POETS will take place Tuesday, September 12<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m., the same night we welcome you to see the FIRST UNVEILING OF THE NEW (incredibly funky) STROLL LOGO. Oh, and the whole night will be filmed by Frame 30 Productions for a possible TV airing. (Michael Hamm of Frame 30 is currently pitching a TV series on Canadian poetry to major networks.)

NOW, on to the REALLY IMPORTANT news. To celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Stroll, we welcome you to a full week of readings (Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup>) with STROLL 2000.

A week's worth of exciting readings (including a Poetry Slam and - gasp! - Triple-X Poetry) means readers will be part of a longer, more dynamic high profile event. As well,

some acclaimed "big ticket" poets should help to make Stroll 2000 more attractive to the media and masses.)

Meanwhile, YES, the standard October Stroll is still VERY happening and VERY vibrant and taking place down Whyte Avenue October 1<sup>st</sup> with a million thanks to Rusti Leahy for soldiering on and co-ordinating it again this year.

Here's something else that's important: YOU. We really, really, really need the help of inspired volunteers to make STROLL 2000 a memorable success. (And helping out helps YOU, because this event WILL raise the public profile of Edmonton poets.)

One more thing: the Stroll Board and I want to thank this year's coordinators for taking on big and wonderful jobs: Rusti Leahy (Stroll Coordinator), Linda Dumont (Anthology editor) and David Huggett (12 Days Coordinator). We're still looking for someone to take on the task of Poetry Tuesdays.

Also, I want to thank everyone on the Board for their blood, sweat, tears, and big brains: Jocko, Gordon McRae, Nancy Mackenzie, Thomas Trofimuk, Cindy Lou Prokopy, Linda Jennings and Beckie Garber-Conrad. You folks set me on fire.






# 2000 STROLL OF POETS SOCIETY GUIDE TO STROLLING

- Poets locate your name on the schedule. Your host (the first name in your reading slot) will call you.
- Note the venue & your reading time.
- Head to your venue. **PLEASE** be prompt. Try to arrive 15 minutes prior to your scheduled time so that you can make contact with your Host.
- You **MUST** have your anthology submission ready for your host at this time! (anthology guidelines below.)
- Please note that poets signing up for the Open Stage, or new Stroll members not on the schedule to read will not be able to submit to the *Anthology* publication.
- Have a great read and remember to have a trial run through of your reading prior to Stroll day to keep it to the **5 minute space** so that you are not running over into another poet's "airtime".

## HOSTS: IMPORTANT!

Hosts: If your name is the first in your reading group and I've asked you to be a host, you said YES and you are hosting, please read your duties and refer to the cheat sheet I have enclosed for you. Thanks a million. All you volunteers are swell!!!




