## About the Stroll of Poets Society

Late last summer a small band of Edmonton poets assembled and decided to put on a poetry festival. The idea was simple: people would stroll from bookstore to bistro in Old Strathcona and listen to poets recite.

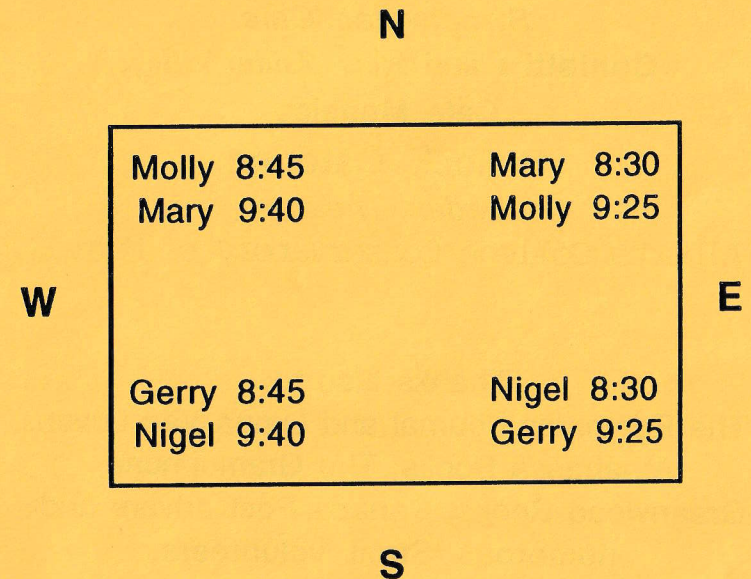
The idea caught on. The poets put on organizers' caps, scrambled about for six weeks, and ended up staging a wonderful festival--A Stroll of Poets--which involved ten bookstores and bistros, and about seventy poets. They also produced and sold a profit-making festival anthology.

After the festival the not-so-small band of poets formed a society. The main object of this society is to promote the acceptance of poetry, to restore the community significance of the bard and his or her works--through such means as poetry readings or festivals. The society is now organizing **The Second Annual Stroll of Poets**, set for **October 4th, 1992**. All poets are welcome.
